Manufacturers around the world transform your waste into new products. Non-recyclable items are sent to the landfill, at higher costs; items may contaminate clean recyclables and damage equipment.





Curbside Recycling Same rules apply to all municipalities in **Ocean County**





Plastic bags, shredded paper, Styrofoam, plastic containers, phone books, chipboard (cereal boxes or paper tubes), paper towels.

Take plastic bags & film to local retailers and supermarkets.

NEVER place them in your curbside recycling.



Food waste comprises 30% of your garbage. Reduce your waste and improve your soil by composting at home.

Chop your materials into smaller pieces, layer green & browns; keep a 50/50 mix. Make sure the last layer is brown to avoid odors. Mix every other week, keep moist and wait.
