- On April 8<sup>th</sup>, from about 2pm until 4:30pm. a **solar eclipse** will visit NJ. The moon will appear almost precisely the same size as the sun, blocking 90% of its rays from reaching earth. Do not look directly at the eclipse. Special glasses may be purchased or an old-fashioned pin-hole projector created to filter the harmful rays. The safest view will be via television or assorted websites.
